Ann Rigney is Professor of Comparative Literature at Utrecht University and founder of the Utrecht Forum for Memory Studies and of NITMES (Network in Transnational Memory Studies). She is a member of the Royal Dutch Academic of Sciences (KNAW) and of the Academia Europea. Since September 2017, she is also Head of the Department of Languages, Literature, and Communication.

Ann Rigney has played a fundamental role in cultural memory studies with a particular focus on issues relating to mediation, transnationalism, and the European project. She has published widely in the field of modern memory cultures. Her many publications include *The Afterlives of Walter Scott: Memory on the Move* (Oxford UP, 2012), *Mediation, Remediation, and the Dynamics of Cultural Memory* (edited with A. Erll, 2009), *Commemorating Writers in Nineteenth-Century Europe: Nation-Building and Centenary Fever* (edited with Joep Leerssen, 2014), and *Transnational Memory: Circulation, Articulation, Scales* (edited with Chiara De Cesari, 2014). She is currently working on a new project related to the long-term cultural memory of protest.
